



OSHA enforcement activity is on the rise and so are penalties for non-compliance. Following are just a few examples:

#### Illinois Metal Treating Facility Cited for 21 Serious Violations

Company faces \$181,662 in penalties after a worker was electrocuted while using a damaged lamp during the cleaning of the inside of a metal tank. [Read More](#)

#### Georgia Distributor Cited for Chemical & Forklift Hazards

Woodgrain Distribution, Inc., was cited and fined \$125,466 for exposing workers to chemical and struck-by hazards. [Read More](#)

#### Two Florida Contractors Cited After Fatal Fall

After a worker was fatally injured in a fall from a work platform, OSHA cited two contractors \$87,327 in penalties for exposing workers to fall, struck-by, and impalement hazards. [Read More](#)

California OSHA issued \$49,500 in penalties after an unstable, unsupported wall collapsed during a building demolition, resulting in fatal injuries to a worker. [Read More](#)

### Incident Investigation

For those that may have missed it, we recently added **Incident Investigation** to our Incident Reporting App.

It's built using the **5-Why Method**. When an incident is submitted, the Administrator will be notified, and the investigation can begin. The Administrator starts the process by creating a "Problem Statement" and then uses our "5-Why" interface to identify causal factors.

From there, you create "Action Items" for each of the causal factors and assign them via email to appropriate personnel. Those responding to action items do not need to have a license.

The system will track the action items and let you know when they are closed. Once all of them are closed, the system will show that the investigation is completed.

- Incident Submitted
- Incident Started
- Action Items Closed

All of this is easily managed through the administrative site.

Oh, one more thing, the Safety Reports **Incident App lets you document incidents remotely using a feature we call "Virtual Safety Reports"**! Imagine being notified of an incident that is miles from your office...with this app, you can connect with someone onsite in minutes and document the incident without ever leaving your office!
