The app works on a mobile platform, such as a tablet or smartphone, and it also works via the web.

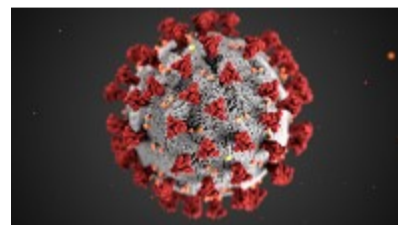

There are an estimated 9,500 Americans diagnosed with skin cancer each day. It's hard to understand why more employers aren't taking steps to minimize this preventable exposure.

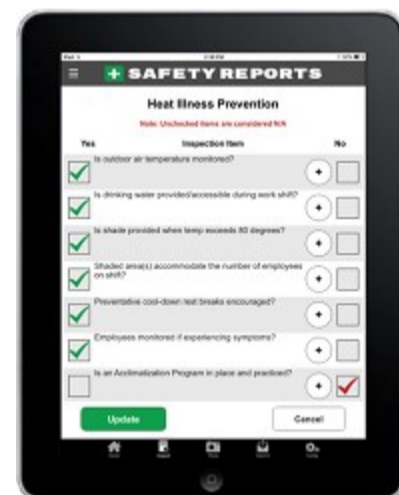
